The Central East Home At Last program is a free service which can provide help to aging adults and adults with special needs, to settle in at home safely and comfortably in a timely manner after a stay in hospital.

Home At Last is a program funded by the Central East Local Health Integration Network. Home At Last is a partnership between hospitals, community support services providers and the Central East Community Care Access Centre.
