The Public Appointments Secretariat of the Province of Ontario has issued an official Order-in-Council appointing Bonnie St. George to the Central East Local Health Integration Network (Central East LHIN) Board of Directors for a three-year term. The appointment was effective as of November 2, 2016.

Ms. St. George is currently a professor in the School of Justice and Emergency Services at Durham College in Oshawa, one of a number of positions she has held since joining the College in 2001. Prior to joining Durham College, she worked for several senior government leaders federally, provincially and municipally, providing policy advice, issues management and strategic support.

Ms. St. George has considerable experience in health care governance, having served on the Lakeridge Health Board of Trustees from 2008–2014, including two years as Board Chair. During her time on the board, she chaired several board committees including Governance, Resources and Quality. Ms. St. George was also a member of the Lakeridge Health Foundation Board from 2012-2014. She has an undergraduate degree in History and Politics, and Masters of Arts in Politics, a Bachelor of Education and recently obtained a Masters of Business Administration.

Born and raised in Campbellford, Ontario, Ms. St. George now resides with her family in Whitby where she enjoys volunteering at Chris Hadfield Public School and participating in the Whitby Terry Fox run.

- The Chair and the Directors are appointed based on their expertise, experience, leadership skills and the needs of the LHIN and are accountable, through the Chair, to the Minister of Health and Long-Term Care for the LHIN's use of public funds and for its results in the local health system.
