Board Chair Foster Loucks is pleased to announce the appointment of three new members to the Board of Directors of the Central East Local Health Integration Network.

Three year appointments for Wayne Gladstone (Port Perry), Samantha Singh (Toronto) and David Sudbury (Ajax) were made by the Lieutenant Governor in Council and endorsed by the Minister of Health and Long-Term Care, Deb Matthews effective June 15, 2010.

Mr. Gladstone was Senior Vice-President of Finance and Administration at OMERS (Ontario Municipal Employees Retirement System) for 15 years where his responsibilities included corporate strategic planning, financial controls and reporting, risk management framework and financial and technology support. A Chartered Accountant and member of the Institute of Corporate Directors and a past board member at Lakeridge Health, Mr. Gladstone is currently a Board member and Chair of the Audit and Finance Committee at HOOPP, the Ontario health care pension fund and serves on the Board of CESO, a volunteer organization working to strengthen social and economic well being in Canada and abroad.

Ms. Singh was called to the Ontario Bar in 2002 and practiced in the area of Insurance Litigation for a number of years. A member in good standing of the Law Society of Upper Canada, she has also taught Health Care Law at George Brown College's Health Information Management Program as well as Introduction to Law and Legal Research & Writing at Seneca College. From 2003 to 2007 Ms. Singh served on the Board of the Scarborough Women's Centre which provides information, education and support to women leaving abusive or isolating situations. During her time at the Centre, Ms. Singh served as chair of various committees and was President of the Board for two years.

Mr. Sudbury is Vice President and Chief Compliance Officer and Corporate Secretary for Honda Financial Services. He first joined Honda Canada in 1982 and has held progressively more senior positions, obtaining his current position in 2006. A past Governor for Junior Achievement of Canada and a Certified Human Resources Professional, Mr. Sudbury is also a graduate of the Canadian Institute of Accountants (Chartered) Chief Financial Officer Program and sits on the Conference Board of Canada Ethics Committee.

- The Board of Directors is accountable, through the Chair, to the Minister of Health and Long-Term Care for the LHIN’s use of public funds, and for its results in terms of goals and performance of the local health system.
